## Quadrennial Periodic Reporting (QPR) to the 2005 UNESCO Convention for the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions

Mauritius is one of the first countries to ratify the UNESCO Convention for the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions in 2006. The Convention provides a plan of action that ensures artists, cultural professionals and creative practitioners, as well as all citizens, have the capacity to create, produce, disseminate and enjoy a broad range of cultural goods, services and activities, including their own.

Quadrennial Periodic Reporting (QPR) is designed to support, through multi-stakeholder dialogues, innovative, forward-looking and evidence-based cultural policymaking by collecting and sharing information, data and statistics. It will help in the implementation of good practices on policies and measures that protect and promote the diversity of cultural expressions in their respective countries.
